The Maryland Civil Rights Congress unanimously voted to send the following telegrams to President Truman and to Governor McKeldin of Maryland protesting the United States Supreme Court decisions against hearings for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and Jesse Reid.

"Help uphold the truth and justice for which our Constitution stands. We urge clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg," stated the Chairman of the Maryland Civil Rights Congress, the Reverend J.E. Harlee of the pentecost Baptist Church, in the telegram to President Truman.

In a telegram to Governor McKeldin, the Reverend Harlee stated, "We strongly urge clemency for Jesse Reid. Stop his legal lynching before too late".

The Maryland Civil Rights Congress, a newly formed local branch of the Civil Rights Congress, holds meetings on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 1224 East Monument Street. The meetings are open to the public, everyone is welcome, admission is free.
