Be A Marshal

On April 24, we will exercise our legal right to demonstrate peacefully for immediate withdrawal from Indochina and an end to the draft. The contrast will be clear to the whole world: on the one hand masses of antiwar Americans - GIs, women, trade unionists, Third World people, students in peaceful and well-ordered assembly to protest a hated war; on the other hand a small group of men prosecuting illegal wars in Indochina against the will of the vast majority of their people, including those sent to do the fighting.

All activities of the National Peace Action Coalition are planned as legal, peaceful and orderly manifestations of opposition to the war.

MARSHALS

Marshals are demonstrators who have been assigned specific tasks and received non-violent training. They are not policemen. The general responsibility of the marshals will be to serve the demonstrators as a whole by maintaining the peaceful and orderly character of the march and rally, provide information, and carry out certain necessary technical jobs.

We need several thousand marshals who will be in Washington by the evening of April 23 so they can be dispatched. Marshal training sessions will be held at several locations in the Washington area during the ten days before the march. Each marshal volunteer should be prepared to attend at least one of these sessions which will last from one to three hours. In addition, volunteers should be prepared to spend from 9am to 6pm on duty on the day of April 24.

CALENDAR OF FALL ANTIWAR ACTIONS

October 13 National Acrotorium

Local activities in cities and towns across America will include marches, teach-ins, meetings, canvassing and other activities to demonstrate our demand for immediate end to the war in Indochina

October 25 Veterans Day

Antiwar actions by veterans and GIs throughout the U.S

October 25 through 29 a week of demonstrations against the war and war-related domestic policies; in Washington, D.C. the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice has called for the following actions:

October 25 "People's Armistice Day" - rally at Sylvan Theater as a Declaration of Peace with the Vietnamese people

October 26 "Attica Memorial Service" - in honor of those killed and as an affirmation of the demand to free all political prisoners held in this country; at White House

October 27 demonstration at Labor and Commerce Dept. in demand of a guaranteed annual income of \$6500 for family of four

October 28 demonstration against the U.S. support of the destruction of the people of East Bengal; at State Dept.

October 29 massive non-violent civil disobedience at the White House demanding an end to the U.S. policy of destruction and injustice at home and throughout the world. In affirmation of Peace and Justice, instead of a policy of hatred.

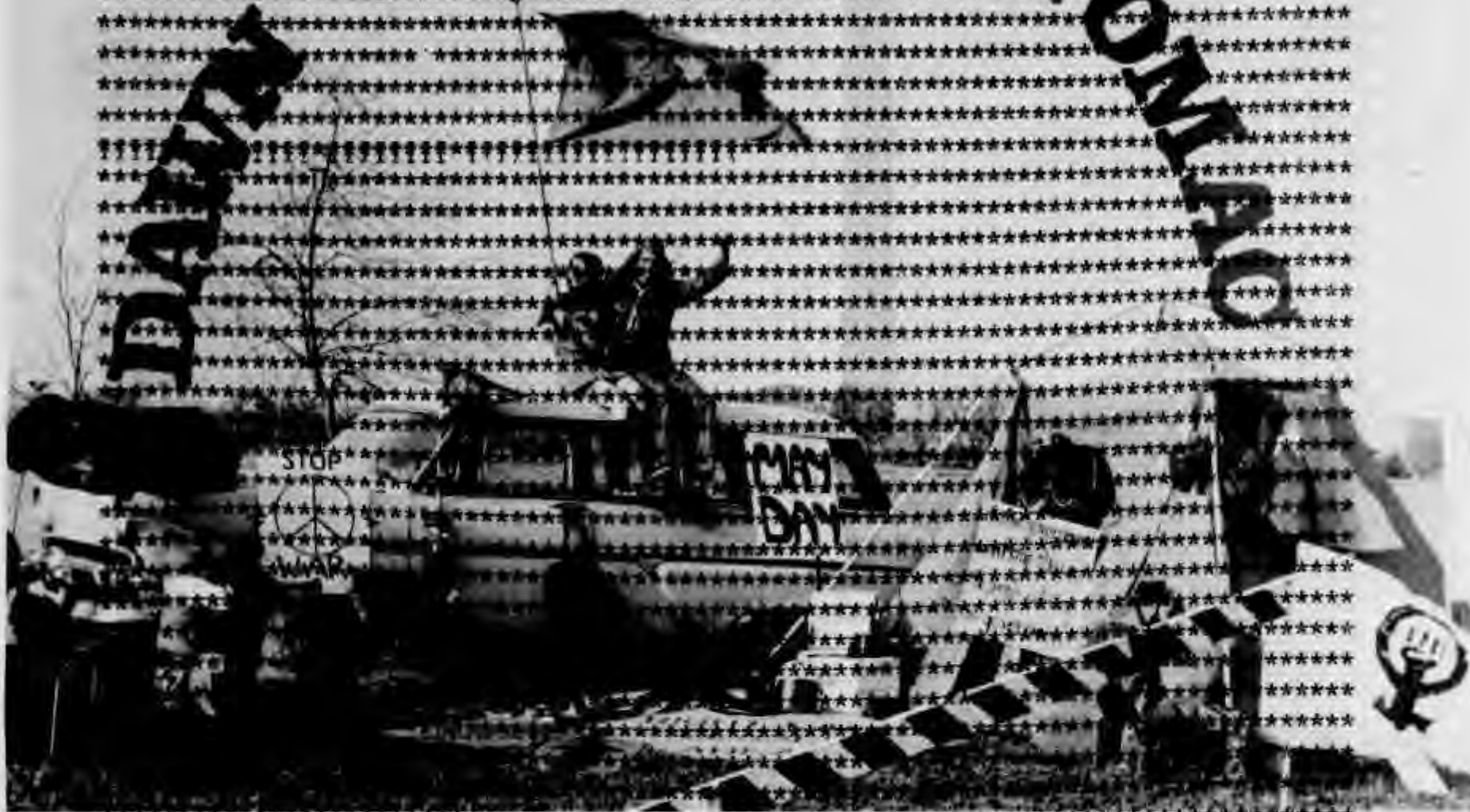
November 3 Student Strike

High schools and universities across America will be turned into antiwar institutions, utilizing their special resources against the war.

November 6 massive antiwar demonstrations in 15 regional centers

across America. All segments of the population, students, labor, GIs, Blacks, professionals, women, and every other constituency will come together in demand of an immediate end to the war in Indochina. Legal marches and rallies will unite hundreds of thousands in a call for "Out Now!"

May Schedule for National Anti-War Demonstrations in Washington, D.C.

May 1 Camp grounds set up at Rock Creek Park. Festival held to celebrate the people's peace. **STOP THE WAR MAKING GOVERNMENT**

May 2 Rally with SCLC, NWO, Peoples Coalition and MayDay Movement at the Sylvania Theater on the Washington Monument grounds. **May 5** Nationwide schools, not business as usual, to enforce May 5th demands. Schools close, businesses stop. Afternoon, move to Capitol and hold Congress in session until Treaty is ratified, guaranteed annual income is approved, and recess is stopped.

May 3-4 Massive non-violent civil disobedience to implement the Peoples Peace Treaty and stop the war.
