Dr. Benjamin Spock, pediatrician, Marcus Raskin, former White House aide, Mitchel Goodman, author, and Michael Ferber, Harvard University graduate student have been indicted for "conspiracy to counsel, aid, and abet Selective Service registrants to resist the draft. In the context of:

- the political prosecution of H. Rap Brown;
- the sentence of two and a half years meted out to LeRoi Jones;
- the indictment of three Southern Conference Educational Fund community organizers on charges of sedition; and
- General Hershey's threat to induct anti-draft workers;
- the White House conferences which led to the new Justice Department unit for the prosecution of draft law violations,

these indictments signal the coming of a time of intensified government repression of all forms of resistance and dissent.

Our movement refuses to be divided or destroyed by these new attempts at intimidation. We call on the American people to pass judgement upon the real conspirators who are pursuing an undeclared war against the Vietnamese people and a program of racist oppression in this country.

We will continue to resist this government's policy of war and racism. We must unite in support of those of us who are the first targets of the administration's plan to stifle opposition. We must act now, lest Americans lose still more of their liberty to question the war in Vietnam and the direction of our nation at home.
