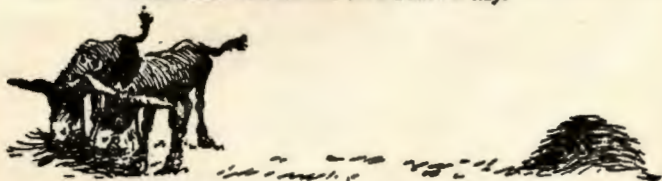
# COOPERATION

And said, "We're acting like *human* fools."




"Let's pull together I'll go your way,
