On October 21, the largest anti-war demonstration ever will be held here in Washington. The concern for peace is being heard increasingly from a larger part of the American public; the rally is to show the rising tide of opposition to the war.

The War Makers and the President are highly sensitive to confrontation in our own city, and we must communicate to them the extent of the protest against the war. The events and newspaper headlines of recent days make it urgent that this must be done now.
