NOTES FROM THE OTHER SIDE

The way the student "leaders" that spoke to the freshmen presented the picture Tech has been one great liberal movement forward and they have been the knights in shining armor—the vanguard of student rights. I do not accuse these students of lying, but I do accuse them of deliberate distortion.

These committees that they sat in on did not help the four students who were accused of soliciting for having taken a poll to see if fellow students agreed with the dress regulations. Two thousand students signed a petition condemning the administration's actions and then the student government—the same group that these "leaders" come from—condemned the action of the students and approved the action taken!! Also ask them why Dr. Maskov was not allowed to speak on the drillfield the first time that he came because he might disturb University life. Or ask why after Carl Oglesby, past president of SDS, appeared at Tech a high administration figure was heard to say that the students were not emotionally capable of dealing with him and the man should never have been allowed on campus. Or ask them why this student document "written entirely by students" does not allow alcohol on campus. Both UVA and William and Mary allow alcohol on campus, and this was one of the student demands that was supposedly "heard and answered."

Yes, by all means look out for the nihilists and those leaders without a plan. Last year they demanded the right to bring in speakers, the right to assemble and to distribute literature. These nihilists believed that the students could hear a speaker and were mature enough to make their own decisions, but first of all, many sides to each story should be told. They were willing to go to court if necessary to win their constitutional rights. Then—and only then—did the administration call on its "student leaders" to reform the rules (note the section on Student Forums) and then decry the nihilists that are merely there to destroy. But they are to learn this year that the students will no longer accept in loco parentis and we will be out on campus to demand our rights.

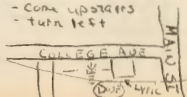
The subscription rate for "alice"—includes the magazine Abraxas—is two dollars / quarter mailed anywhere in the U.S.
