SATURDAY, AUGUST 23, 11 am to 5 pm - WOMEN'S FAIR an annual event sponsored by the Metropolitan Chapters of the National Organization for Women. Everyone is invited and there is no admission fee. This year the Women's Fair will emphasize the creative spirit (organizational and individual) that flows as a life blood through each of us--and so, rather than the usual promotion of position papers, organizational brochures and craft displays, the women involved will attempt to share the impetus that demands the silver be fashioned, the organization be formed, and the soul reach for new heights of liberation. To act out this celebration of ourselves, areas are set aside for the participants to use in the creation of environments that attempt to share their message. For example, Career Empowerment for Women, which helps women find new approaches to the job world, will have a life-size maze at the Fair. Is there a way out of the maze that hinders women's career potential? Come to the Fair and find out. The League of Women Voters, a non-partisan political organization which grew from the suffragette movement, will be there to celebrate women's contributions to responsive government.
