In the last Chipmunk, a new method of operating CHIPS was suggested which would not require each member to send in 70 copies of each issue. Instead, they would have been able to mail us as many copies as they wanted to, and the number they received back would depend on how many were sent in.

The response to the idea has been mixed. Some papers preferred the old method, some the new one, and many suggested working out a third alternative, which would keep the best aspects of each idea. So we have worked out a new method, which seems to meet the needs of all the papers, and which will go into effect immediately.

Membership is open to independent or underground papers at high schools, junior highs, and elementary schools in the U.S. or Canada. A paper can join by filling out a form giving its name, mailing address, and other information for our use and for the directory, and after that the only obligation of members is to send us three copies of each issue that they publish. Papers which want to participate in the exchange should send us 65 copies of each issue during March, and we will print each month how many are needed. Exchange packets will be mailed out at the end of each month to papers that either:

1. Send in the necessary number of copies, or
2. Normally participate in the exchange but instead send a letter saying that they aren't printing an issue that month, or
3. Have sent enough copies in the past, but didn't send anything. In this case we'll assume that they simply forgot, or the mail

took longer than expected.

We will not mail out the complete packets to papers that we have not heard from for many months, and which for all we know are dead.

Members which send in a bundle of papers but not enough to get the full exchange packet will receive packets at the end of the month containing any copies of other papers that were left over.

The newsletter will be sent to each paper once a month whether that paper is participating in the exchange or not. We'll try to keep the membership list updated, and papers which we don't hear from for long periods of time, and which don't respond to letters, will be dropped from the list.

Listed on the next sheet are all the papers that are currently members of CHIPS. The ones with an asterisk are the ones which we have mailed exchange packets to for this month. New members are joining very rapidly, and the number of active members should rise considerably during this spring, as it did at the same time last year.

If your phone number is not listed, please let us know what it is. On some papers, we do not know if it is all right to list the address, so there are dashes where the street address should be. If you want the full address for your paper printed on future lists, write and say so.
