4th Annual Lambda Literary Awards Finalists

The intense competition for the gay men's fiction nomination of the Fourth Annual Lambda Literary Awards exemplified the phenomenal growth of gay and lesbian literature. The Awards, recognizing excellence in gay and lesbian writing and publishing, will be presented during a gala celebration in Anaheim, California on Friday, May 22, 1992, on the eve of the American Booksellers Association Convention.

Readers from around the country sent in ballots naming over 30 titles for the gay men's fiction award. The five gay men's fiction finalists represent a broad range of contemporary gay fiction: Harlan Greene's poetic, regional *What the Dead Remember*, Dennis Cooper's grisly, controversial *Frisk*, Melvin Dixon's experimentations with point of view in *Vanishing Rooms*, Philip Gambone's essays into the dailiness of ordinary gay life, *The Language We Use Up Here*, and the tense negotiations of estranged brothers—one gay with AIDS, one a married hetero-

sexual—in Paul Monette's *Halfway Home*.

Another strong category indicative of the depth of contemporary gay and lesbian thought were the titles selected for the Lesbian Nonfiction Award. These include pioneering historian Lillian Faderman's study of American lesbian life, *Odd Girls and Twilight Lovers*; Sandra Butler and Barbara Rosenblum's moving account of Rosenblum's losing struggle with breast cancer, *Cancer in Two Voices*; a rich anthology of writing about lesbian sexuality, *An Intimate Wilderness*; Lamont Poetry Prize winner Minnie Bruce Pratt's penetrating essays, *Rebellion*, and Diana Souhami's hymn to Gertrude Stein and Alice B. Toklas' "marriage," *Gertrude and Alice*.

1991 was also a good year for gay men's anthologies, lesbian fiction, gay men's non-fiction and lesbian poetry, where the national book award nominee Adrienne Rich (*An Atlas of the Difficult World*) was joined by

Staff Profile

Lesborado Karen Bullock-Jordan delves into leather and practices wicca

"Sex and chocolate," says Karen Bullock-Jordan, "are the two things that make life worth living."

Chicago native Karen, who is a night manager at Lambda Rising, traces her presence in Washington, D.C. to the nine months she spent hitch hiking in Europe after her freshman year at Brandeis University.

First, while she was in Europe, her mother enrolled her at the D.C. based-Howard University. Second, she met a woman: "I thought she was just being friendly, but she was trying to pick me up!" Karen says.

Karen spent two years at Howard, but "couldn't get into the swing of things." Partly, it's because the multitasking Karen had trouble picking a major. Then, too, she says she "couldn't find the lesbian and gay people" on campus, largely because she decided not to



live in a dorm. "I didn't want to have to come out to a stranger as a lesbian and a witch."

In D.C., Karen has a high profile as a member of "Lesborados," a women's S/M leather group she and her lover founded. "When I met Naria, within five minutes we both knew we were into S/M. After the National Lesbian conference, we finally organized Lesborados."

"I'm over trying to get people to understand it," Karen says. "It's all about consent and love. I like powerful women, think of myself as a powerful woman. Mix that with sexuality, and it's a real turn on."

And the witch craft? She says that she cannot get into Christianity. "It's so male identified. In 'wicca,' the goddess is inside of us, not just outside."

How does her mother react to all this? "First she laughed. Then, she was afraid I would get in over my head. Now she calls me up for protection rituals and love rituals."

She's not sure if her mother will come to the commitment ceremony she's planning for the next year. But, she says, "My mother refers to Naria as her son-in-law, so she knows she's going to be in my life for a long time."

Marcus Monette McCauley... and Severna Park, too

Gay Pride readings feature oral history, autobiography, comedy and a new science fiction writer

Lambda Rising/D.C. kicks off June with former Good Morning, America producer, Eric Marcus, who was widely praised for his first book, *The Gay Male Couples Guide to Living Together*. Marcus has just published an absolutely splendid book of oral history tracing 40 years of the gay rights movement, *Making History*.

"When I started work on the book," Marcus says, "I had the 'popular' view of gay history: it all began with the Stonewall Riots in New York City in 1969. And I wondered about all of these 'political activists'."

Three years, thousands of miles, over 100 formal interviews (49 of which made the book) and many informal conversations later, Marcus knows the origins of the gay rights movement go much further back. His oral histories begin with "Lisa Ben," a Los Angeles "gay gal" who published the first gay magazine in the late 1940's. Marcus' interviews continue to the present, and not only feature many gay pioneers, including Jean O'Leary, football star Dave Kopay, Larry Kramer, and MCC minister Carolyn Mobley, but also many sympathetic non-gay people, such as psychologist Evelyn Hooker, Episcopal Bishop John Shelby Spong and Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays president Paulette Goodman.

In the process, Marcus says, he became "one of the converted." As he transcribed these stories, he says he "cried through the interviews" at the "loss, waste of time and ruined lives." You'll cry—and laugh, and gain a new appreciation for the courage of gay people from this powerful book.

Following Eric Marcus' oral history will be Paul Monette's personal history, *Becoming a Man*. With a mixture of pain, humor and humanity, Monette details his childhood in New England in the '50s, pretending to be like everyone else, but knowing he was different. This is a story of growing up gay and about the tyranny and self-hatred of the closet. It is also a book about America, from the starchy halls of privilege at Andover and Yale to the golden states of California—the white bread 50's, the rebellious 60's, the self-creating 70's.

Monette is the author of six novels, including the American Library Association award-winning *Half-Way Home*, and the highly acclaimed *Borrowed Time: An AIDS Memoir* (1988), as well as three books of poetry.

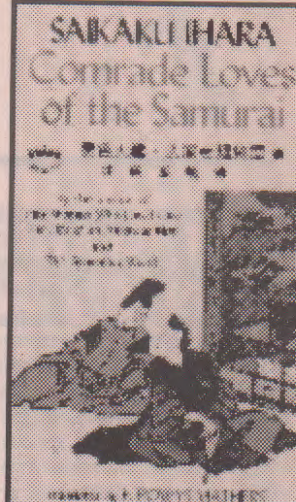

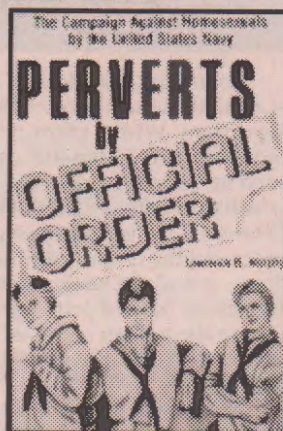

four other fine poets, including Eloise Klein Healy (*Artemis in Echo Park*), Maureen Seaton (*Fear of Subways*), Becky Birtha (*The Forbidden Poems*) and Eileen Myles (*Not Me*). It was a year in which the emerging African-American gay community found recognition with five nominees—*Brother to Brother*, *The Road Before Us*, *Vanishing Rooms*, *The Forbidden Poems* and *The Gilda Stories*, nominated in two categories.

The mix of gay male and lesbian titles in the humor category was at least a metaphor for a trend in gay literature, the increasing

numbers of books aimed at both male and female audiences, a trend typified by *Indivisible*, a collection of short stories by both gay men and lesbians. Another sort of "cross-over" was indicated by the dominance by mainstream presses of some categories, such as Men's Fiction, as well as the strong presence of books from University Presses, a sign that gay and lesbian studies are becoming an inseparable part of the academy.

Not that the gay small presses ceased from producing pioneering books; Alyson Publications expanded its line of fascinating

books for children, while the small press category included one by the lesbian "Ann Landers", *Advocate* columnist Pat Califia's *The Advocate Advisor* (Alyson); a practical guide to the gay publishing market, *Putting Out '91* (Putting Out Books); a retrospective of 20 years of gay publishing, *Gay Roots* (Gay Sunshine Press), and an avant-garde examination of gay and lesbian images, *How Do I Look?* (Bay Press). Even the smallest of small presses was honored with the presence of lesbian novelist Garbo's winning self-published first novel of working class lesbian

life, *Rusty* (Big Breakfast).

The nominees were selected from thousands of ballots sent in from readers of *The Lambda Book Report*, which sponsors the award, and others from around the country. A total of 73 titles from 43 different publishers were selected as the finalists. Boston's gay press, Alyson Publications, led the pack with 12 titles, followed closely by Viking with 10 and Naiad Press of Tallahassee, Florida, with six.

first novel, *The Object of My Affection*, it was greeted by a chorus of delight. "A very funny, exceptionally vivid first novel," raved *The New York Times Book Review*.

That chorus will only swell with the publication of McCauley's new novel, *Easy Way Out*. The novel follows Patrick, a Cambridge Massachusetts travel agent, his lover Arthur, his family and friends, as they negotiate the ups—and downs—of love and relationships. Add McCauley's offbeat sense of humor, Sharon, Patrick's completely original, chain-smoking colleague at the travel agency, and an against-the-grain ending, and the sum is a book that will move into your heart and stay there. "A joyous novel"—praises Harlan Greene in *The Lambda Book Report*.

Speaking Dreams, a science fiction tale set in a grim dystopian future, is the first novel of a Washington D.C.-Baltimore area native. The youthful "Severna Park" says she took her pen name from an interstate exit sign: "the other choice was Glen Burnie."

In the world of *Speaking Dreams* the empire that dominates the galaxy is deteriorating and threatened by monstrous aliens. A young slavegirl, Costa, is reluctantly bought by the diplomat Mira LoDire. As an unavoidable confrontation between three factions unfolds, so, too does the love of the two women for each other. Unknown to others, Costa possesses information that can forever change the balance of galactic power. Tender love scenes and dramatic action unite to produce a story the *Lambda Book Report* calls "compelling."

June is National Gay and Lesbian Book Month.

The gay and lesbian book world is gearing up for the first ever National Gay and Lesbian Book Month, designated, of course, for June. The month-long promotion is sponsored by The Publishing Triangle, an organization of gay publishing professionals with chapters in New York and San Francisco. As New York publishing consultant Robert Riger explains the idea, "We want to provide a catalytic environment" both for publishing and promoting gay and lesbian titles.

What powers this chemistry, according to The Publishing Triangle, is the sensational market for gay and lesbian books: high annual incomes, high customer interest in books, and big sales figures. [Some of the Publishing Triangle statistics were based on the Overlooked Opinion survey of *Lambda Rising News* readers featured this past winter.] A dozen sponsors, ranging from *The Advocate* to St. Martin's Press' gay book line, Stonewall Edition, are financing the publicity effort.

One of the mainstream sponsors, NAL/

Dutton, is mounting an aggressive promotion of its gay and lesbian books, which it touts as "the preeminent program in the industry." Dutton notes that not only are its books winning Lambda Literary Award nominations, but they are also being selected by the mass market giants Book of the Month

Club and Quality Paperback Clubs. Snatching both of those sales plums was anthropologist John Preston, whose sensational collection of gay erotica, *Flesh and the Word*, holds the number one spot on our gay men's paperback charts. Preston will follow up his current string of successes (which includes the hardback best seller, *Hometowns*) with another anthology *A Member of the Family: Gay Men Write about Their Closest Relations*, due out later this year. Other Dutton titles featured in this edition of *The Lambda Rising News* include *Fag Hag*, by Robert Rodi, *Basard Out of Carolina*, by Dorothy Allison, and *Herotica 2*, edited by Susie Bright and Joani Blank.

A number of books in this catalog don a little lambda next to their notice. These titles are featured here as a courtesy to those publishers who advertised these titles in our sister publication, **LAMBDA BOOK REPORT: A REVIEW OF CONTEMPORARY GAY AND LESBIAN LITERATURE**.
