ALDERSON PRISON DEMONSTRATION

SAT., OCT. 2, 1:00 PM

On October 2, we are marching to Alderson Federal "Reformatory" for Women - and on prisons around the country - to unite ourselves with our sisters and brothers on the inside. The October 2 date coincides with the non-elections of South Vietnam in order to make clearer the connection between the political use of prisons both in the U.S. and South Vietnam, and most especially the imprisoning of activists for peace and liberation in both countries.

In support of their brothers at Attica and the 35 inmate demands, the women incarcerated at Alderson demonstrated peacefully. The demonstration developed into a total strike with the women refusing to return to their "cottages."

Later they met with representatives of the federal prison parole board and presented additional demands including fair wages for work performed in the jail (they presently receive 7c an hour); mail privileges; and treatment facilities for addicts (there are none at Alderson now).

Frustrated by the out-of-hand rejection of their demands and the harsh and adamant attitude of the prison officials, the women rioted. They were all then locked into the cottages. Three sisters "escaped" from the rooms to talk to the press and tell them the Alderson story.

Unprecedented actions have been taken against the women who presented the demands. Sixty-six, at this time, have been transferred to Ashland, Ky., and male guards now patrol Alderson to enforce "order."

We ask everyone concerned with the terrible conditions, abuse and repression, in all of America's jails to demonstrate that concern by going to Alderson, W. Va., on October 2. Speakers will include Du Courney Squire of the Flower City Conspiracy; Bud Murphy, Camden 28; Pam Meyers, Prisoners Solidarity Committee; Denise Oliver; and a speaker from the New York Third World Women's Coalition; and Mary Scoblick.
