

ABOUT SUSTAINING THE WASHINGTON AREA WOMEN'S CENTER...

Call it tithing, call it membership, call it sustaining - the name of the game is commitment.

An on-going, personal commitment to the Women's Center can take many forms. Only one of them, but an important one, is personal financial commitment. Many women who work in "straight" jobs or have other sources of income can help in a way that is no less important than devoting their time - they can help keep the Center going by sending monthly sustainers in the amounts they can afford.

Until we build our financial resources to the level that will enable us to get a house, monthly sustainers will provide badly needed income for the expenses we have already incurred. After we have a house, monthly sustainers will be our most valuable source of income - we must depend on ourselves, on women, to support women, rather than depend wholly on outside sources whose interest in the Center may be limited.

In addition, monthly support from the community of women is an affirmation of our service to the community - very important if we expect to receive the initial outside financial aid to get a house, purchase equipment, and generally get off to a good start.

We've enclosed a sustainer form. Please fill it out completely and return it as soon as you've decided the amount of your sustainer. Our monthly income (like everything in the Center) is dependent upon all of us keeping our commitments. If you find you want to change the amount, i.e. monthly or in total, please request another sustainer form at that time.

We have applied for tax-exempt status, but at this date our application is still pending. Our attorney feels that tax-exempt status will be granted. When it is, contributions given before the granting-date will still be deductible. That is, the tax-exempt status will be retroactive.
