RECOUPING & TRYING AGAIN

On Tues. Sept. 2, the Executive Board met to discuss the events of the summer and the future of the Center. Due to difficulties in staffing the Center in all its functions--telephone referrals, newsletter publication, and program development, the Board feels that the present structure of the Center is virtually nonfunctional. It was created several years ago when the Movement was young and collectivity was in its optimistic heyday. Many

women found in the Center their first introduction to the Women's Movement and were concerned and involved with the Center's activities and project groups. The Women's Center was the birthplace of a number of programs that now exist and thrive on their own. Time has passed and as the Movement has grown, women have founded their own projects based on a high level of individual interest and community need and/or appeal. This kind of growth

and variety of programs and projects is what makes D.C. an exciting place to live and a national center of feminist culture and politics.

The Women's Center is still operating under the original structure which implicitly requires the participation and input of a large number of women to function effectively and efficiently. For many reasons the present level of interest in the Center and its programs is not enough to

maintain the functioning processes that are dictated by the structure of the Center. It is for this reason as well as financial problems that the Board is proposing a redirecting of energy and restructuring of programs.

A women's center can have two purposes: outreach and community service. Both can be served at the same location as long as the intent is clear for each and energy high enough to sustain the required programs. With D.C.'s resources of time and money, the Center in an attempt to do both together, has done neither well. It has offered a referral service to women who will probably never have any other need for the Center and has published this newsletter which is, hopefully, of value to women who are already interested in or involved with feminist activities. The Center has also sponsored a number of concerts and special programs. The Board is therefore considering giving up the building on 18th Street which is an enormous drain of money and energy, in favor of developing those three activities in which the Center has experienced positive feedback and interest. The Women's Center could function cheaply and efficiently from one room, clearly dividing the three activities and responsibilities. It has been proposed that the telephone number become that of a women's switchboard (which it was originally) supported by an answering service available on a contract basis to women's groups, individuals and businesses. The newsletter will be expanded to include coverage of women's events in Washington and offer space for advertising and personals in addition to a more extensive calendar. The Center would continue to sponsor programs and concerts and other groups or individuals interested in holding special events could use the Center as a sponsor with its mailing lists, publicity and non-profit status. Memberships will be maintained and continue to offer the same benefits including member's discounts at Center-sponsored events and cooperating feminist businesses, the newsletter subscription, and WAFFCU membership.

The is an open meeting for all Women's Center members on Tuesday Sept. 30 at 5:30 pm to discuss these proposals and to make decisions about the future of the Center. We need your input--what are realistic goals for the Center and what needs could it be meeting. 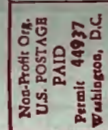
